
JUIT YOUTH CLUB (JYC)

MURIOUS TECH FEST 2019






Event-9: International Day of Yoga






JUIT - IEEE Student Branch INTERNET OF THINGS August 29 – 31, 2019



Annual Sports Fest PRAKARAM 2019




The first day of the tournament saw very competitive matches, and an equally enthusiastic audience response. The second day witnessed the final and semifinal clashes between the winners of




JYC activities JUIT Youth Parliament November 23 – 24, 2019

Later, for the night, Hackathon, a 12 hour nonstop working and creating your own little phenomenal prototype competition was




pitching session began infront of the Judging panel which includes TIEDC Chairman Prof. Ashish Kumar, Dr. Amit Kumar (CSE/IT), an
