




MUN (Model United Nations)




WE CARE

MURIOUS TECH FEST 2021



THE PERILS OF SMOKING, DRUGS AND ALCOHOL


24 August 2020




Activities under Fit India Movement TALK ON NUTRITION AND DIET 29 August 2020






Activities under Fit India Movement FIT INDIA FREEDOM RUN 26 September 2020



- (3) Security and surveillance




Health and Environment Club WE CARE April 6-7, 2021




Club event BIONERA – ALUMNI INTERACTION & QUIZ May 15, 2021




