• <u>Lucknow Central - 28 Oct, 17</u>: First entertainment movie for the session 2017-18 attracted quite a large crowd.




- India vs. New Zealand T20 1 Nov, 17: T20 series between India and New Zealand was live streamed.

workshop was conducted for two days.




Fukrey Returns - 20 Jan, 18: Second entertainment movie presented in the auditorium for the session.


GEETA IN HOUSE-BLACK AND WHITE.

PROCEEDINGS: DAY 1

The 1st Day of the Lok Sabha started with the Secretary General declaring the council open. National Anthem and Oath taking ceremony followed and the proceedings started with the Scribe, Ms. Vaani Mahesh Rana taking the attendance of the parliamentarians. The attendance concluded and the simple majority was established at 40.

Mr. Narendra Modi, as the leader of the house, started with the statements addressing the agenda and through it, his fellow parliamentarians. The leader of the Opposition, Mr. Mallikarjun Kharge, followed Modi's speech of Shayaris, with some of his own. With these 2 speeches the momentum of the house was set at a high note, but came down bluntly owing to monotonus speeches and extensive use of the Points of Order (which in all essence were just twisted use of Points of Information).

Discussion Hour was in motion next, and the council focused with full exuberance on topics or Religious and Gender inequality. While the opposition challenged the bill on Triple Talaq in regard of the nature and duration of the punishment that is to be enforced, the ruling party made believe the council on all accounts that the provisions of the Bill were foolproof and necessary provisions, wherever necessary, had been made.

With a Point of Parliamentary enquiry, the parliamentarian of the INC made his feelings known about the how the rulings by simple majority is harming his party and the motions which they wish to raise. Many such unnecessary inquiries and deviation from the agenda at hand, sure made it easy to notice how vaguely the parliamentarians had researched the content.

In a council where marriage was termed as "contract" and Ayodhya as the "land of Lord Ram", it was but a wonder to see the EB giving chance to almost every parliamentarian to put forth their opinions in the house.

After the high tea, the zero hour was put into motion and saw bombardment of some really good questions from the opposition side which left the ruling party chasing their tales and answering with but the play of words. The decorum of the house was disrupted with blame games, allegations and cross talks which left the session without any closure and hopes for a better discussion the next day.

LOK SABHA - HOUSE OF THE PEOPLE; MAD PEOPLE.

From flying paper planes in an important session to shouting at top of their lungs in Parliament, not-so-serious antics are common in the house. This articulation emphasizes over our applauded and grandstander members of Parliament.

But no doubt both the parties being different sides of the same coin, have the art of looking for controversies and troubles finding them everywhere, diagnosing them incorrectly and applying the wrong remedies. However hard you try to span the history but it becomes mere failure in front of researched content.

BJP piggybacking on propaganda movies to keep morale high among its troops from reel to real, 'How is the josh' has become the slogan of the season the council's response proved it. The council also featured A Hug, Wink and 'Earthquake' Rahul Gandhi wants us to believe that a new-generation, metrosexual gentleness can combat hard-line machismo. 

Literary and Debating Club




QAFILA – ONE TAKE & ACOUSTIC DUSK





VIRTUAL FAREWELL PARTY
